Sheena Falconer is the Executive Director for West Coast Aquatic Stewardship Association. For the past four years her work has focused on habitat restoration projects, enhancement, stewardship and education. Her latest endeavor is the Alberni Aquarium and Stewardship Centre, which opened on May 1st and is already drawing both crowds and kudos.

She has worked closely with the Tseshaht and Huu-ay-aht First Nations, as well as with the Port Alberni School District. Sheena's infectious enthusiasm can be witnessed every day at the aquarium and in her work with Wild BC delivering and developing programs to engage school age students with the outdoors

SUNSHINE COAST TRAIL

PANELIST

From vision to action: How did they do it?

Eagle Walz is the president and co-founder of the Powell River Parks and Wilderness Society (PRPAWS). Formed in 1992, the organization's vision was to protect old growth forests by building a 180km hiking trail with the explicit purpose of providing public access to the magnificent stands and breathtaking attractions en route.

Eagle believes in the motto "it takes a community to build a trail". Since his retirement, he has been instrumental in bringing groups together to realize the society's vision.

Beginning in 2009, he undertook the five-year PRPAWS shelter construction project with funding from the Island Coastal Economic Trust, donations and more than 11,000 hours of volunteer labour. The result is Canada's longest hut-to-hut hiking trail. In the fall of 2015, the Sunshine Coast Trail was recognized by Explore Magazine as one of the Best 50 Hikes in the World.

Eagle has written the trail guidebook "The Sunshine Coast Trail: Hut-to-Hut Hiking" and continues to work on enhancing and promoting the trail, attracting global adventurers to the Upper Sunshine Coast.

BILL MORRISON

UCLUELET AQUARIUM

From vision to action: How did they do it?

Bill Morrison was the founding president of the Ucluelet Aquarium Society and is still active with the organization. Outside of those volunteer duties, he is currently an instructor at North Island College's Ucluelet Centre.

GUEST SPEAKERS

Bill spent his career on the west coast of Vancouver Island in both the commercial fishing and education sectors. These interests found common ground in the early days of the Ucluelet Mini Aquarium. The Ucluelet Aquarium underwent a transformation of almost \$2 million, moving from a popular but very small facility, to one of the top visitor amenities in the region.

Bill was at the forefront of the team that led the expansion, bringing project champions, funders and community members together.

JIM MARTIN

From vision to action: How did they do it?

'Oyster' Jim Martin is the visionary behind the spectacular Wild Pacific Trail in Ucluelet. When asked about his approach to building it, he states: "I start from impossible and work backwards from there."

After moving to Ucluelet in 1979 as an oyster farmer, Jim began exploring the rugged coastline where he realized that a hiking trail could provide free public access to magnificent coastal vistas. From building trails himself, to corralling volunteers and securing funding partners, 'Oyster' Jim has become synonymous with the Wild Pacific Trail.

In recognition of his work, he was recently awarded a BC Community Achievement Award.
